Toledo, Ohio Picks R44 for Fire & Police

**Departments** 

The city of Toledo, Ohio has purchased a new R44 Police Helicopter, dubbed "Air One," for use by the police and fire departments. The aircraft will be used for surveillance, search and rescue, night patrol, to monitor chases, and other emergency situations.

The police department aviation unit commander, Lt. Leo Eggert and Officer Jeff Violanti flew the aircraft from the Robinson factory in Torrance, California. The helicopter cost approximately \$504,000 and is equipped with a full range of law enforcement options including a searchlight and infrared camera. The city

paid for "Air One" with funds from a federal grant and department reserves.

Members of the aviation unit, which includes Lt. Eggert, Officer Violanti, Gary Bunting and Bruce Helppie, completed approximately three months of flight training earlier in the year at Quantum Helicopters, a

Robinson-authorized dealer and service center based in Chandler Arizona. They trained primarily in Robinson's smaller 2seat R22 helicopter, and three of the four officers earned their private rotorcraft ratings. Lt. Eggert - who was already a licensed fixed-wing instructor - added rotorcraft to his flight instructor rating that will allow him to pilot the aircraft and teach students, including his officers.

### **AIA Figures Confirm R22 & R44 Top Selling Helicopters**

The latest Aerospace Industries Association sales figures once again place Robinson Helicopter Company in the number one position for North American civil helicopter sales, with deliveries totalling 197 units during the first half of 2001 - up 8% compared to the same period last year.

Robinson delivered 79 R22s and 118 R44s during the first six months of the year, making the R44 "Number 1" in sales, and the R22, "Number 2." The total combined deliveries of 197 new aircraft is over three times the number delivered by any of the other eight manufacturers in North America. The nearest competitor in terms of units delivered was Bell with 54 ship-

Piston helicopters continue to dominate the new helicopter market, primarily due to the popularity of the R22 and R44 helicopters. Of the 303 new civil helicopters delivered in the first half of 2001, 72% were powered by piston engines.

# Robinson Dealer Shizuka Saito Receives 2001 Air Sports Medal from France's FAI

France's Federation Aeronautique International (FAI), the official organization for world aviation records and accomplishments, awarded the 2001 Air Sports Medal to Shizuka Saito to recognize her work organizing Japanese helicopter teams and her outstanding participation in helicopter sports and competition. This medal was established by the FAI Council in 1991, the hundredth anniversary of Otto Lilienthal's first flights, and is given to individuals or groups for outstanding services in connection with air sport activities.

Saito was one of only three individuals so recognized this year, and the *Japan Aeronautique Association* held an awards ceremony for Saito and others for their exemplary industry service.

Since 1999, Japanese helicopter teams

have been extremely successful flying R22 helicopters in the world helicopter championships and have greatly contributed to the popularity of helicopter sports in Japan. Last year, Saito and fellow team-member, Takashi Tanizawa won gold medals flying their R22 helicopters in the World Helicopter Championships in Sevilla, Spain. Saito's gold medal was in the Precision Flying and Landing Event. The Japanese teams also earned silver and bronze medals, finished fourth overall of the sixteen teams that participated.

Saito is the founder and president of *Alpha Aviation Company* based in Tokyo, a factory-authorized dealer and service center for Robinson R22 and R44 helicopters. The company was established in 1985 and offers pilot training, charter, aerial

### St. Maarten Police on Patrol in New R44

The St. Maarten Police Department in the Netherland Antilles purchased a new R44 Police helicopter earlier this year and have already completed over 600 flight hours.

The aircraft is flown seven days a week and is used primarily for patrol, search and rescue, crime response, and narcotic interdiction. To get the unit up and flying as quickly as possible, California-based *Air Support Consultants* (ASC) assisted with flight training and tactical instruction. *ASC* pres-

ident, Bob Muse, reports, "We were able to take them from no operation to fully operational within two weeks. Our primary concern was that they establish a safe and effective operation."

Successful missions so far have included locating a capsized boat and assisting with passenger rescue, interception of a boat carrying 250 kilos of narcotics, and first on the scene and coordination of the arrest of 27 persons involved in prostitution, illegal gambling and pornographic business activities on the internet.

# Lightweight Oil Filter For New R22 and R44 Helicopters


Robinson has developed a new oil filter for the R22 and R44 helicopters which is less costly and much lighter than previous filters. The new filter will be available as an option on new aircraft, and a retrofit kit is planned for older R22 helicopters.

The filter installation directly replaces the standard oil screen adapter and only adds 2.3 pounds, including the spin-on filter filled with oil. This is a 3.6-pound reduction in the installation weight compared to the previous design.

The installation uses a readily available Champion filter plus the current temperature probe, thermostatic bypass valve, gasket, and mounting hardware. No hoses are required.

The list price for the filter installation is \$1,000 when ordered with a new R22 or R44 helicopter, and \$1,400


when ordered as a retrofit kit for older R22s. Unfortunately, a retrofit kit for the R44 is not available due to required struc-



tural changes. Installation of the oil filter increases the time between oil changes from 25 to 50 hours.

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## 1st Robinson Helipad Set for Approval



The first Robinson rooftop helipad has received FAA approval and is on track for final approval in early 2002. When Robinson announced plans to promote small rooftop helipads, a search began for California industrial park owners to partner the factory in the design, installation, and approval of one or more 'prototype' pads. In exchange, Robinson would pay the cost of the helipad for the first few that also buy a new R44 helicopter. In June 2001, Ron Vinci threw his hat into the ring and committed to the purchase of a new R44 and the installation of the first lightweight rooftop helipad.

Vinci owns *Honda of Santa Ana*, an automobile dealership in Southern California. The pad will be installed on the roof of the dealership's service center, which is a concrete tilt-up structure and requires no structural reinforcement to meet current California Building Codes and to accommodate the weight of the helicopter or the pad itself. The only modifications needed are a stairwell to the roof and a hatch at the top of the stairs.

Robinson heliport coordinator, Jen

McSkimming, prepared paperwork for FAA, city, and state approvals and will testify in upcoming hearings and meetings. Daniel Roth, P.E. and engineer at Robinson, designed the helipad and support structure, and also provided calculations and other data to city planners.

The process is long, but not impossible. In June, after Vinci agreed to buy an R44, McSkimming prepared FAA forms and received approval by the end of July. Next came local city officials; Robinson assisted by providing data to the Santa Ana planning and airport land use commis-

sions. A public hearing will be held in November, with a city council vote the following month. Following city council approval, the State of California will be the final hurdle. McSkimming expects the State's stamp of approval by January 2002, allowing Vinci to begin construction of the helipad in early 2002.

Robinson's offer to provide free helipads is still open to purchasers of new R44s in Southern California for a limited time.
